Studies show that rates of substance use disorders are 2-4 times higher among lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and questioning (LGBTQ+) youth than their heterosexual peers. LGBTQ+ youth report higher rates of cigarette, alcohol, and marijuana use, and are also more likely to use street drugs such as cocaine, methamphetamine, and injection drugs.

In this webinar for providers, we will learn about some of the barriers LGBTQ+ youth face and explore best practices for engaging and addressing their needs. We can all help create safer, more nurturing environments for LGBTQ+ youth.
