Community Reentry Project (CRP) is a multi-stakeholder project that facilitates a system of holistic health services that connects people who are justice-impacted living with and at highest risk of HIV to an array of services, including medical care, mental health, and overall wellness.

CRP partners include non-profit and community-based organizations, cross-sector government agencies, and other institutions that work with PHIMC to address policies, bridge gaps, and leverage resources for individuals who are justice-impacted.

PHIMC serves as the convener and grants manager for CRP partner agencies to provide strategic planning, fiscal management, and program management and monitoring.

## Impact of Community Reentry Project

- Improved health outcomes for people living with and at highest risk for HIV who are re-entering Illinois communities.
- Increased HIV testing in county jails throughout Illinois and the Illinois Department of Corrections (IDOC) system.
- Reduced HIV transmission in Illinois communities through education, testing, and suppressed viral loads.
